She also graduated AG2 finally and will be in AG3 this next session. Murphy is busy being a puppy. He starts his first puppy class next week.

Tara Barrett: We tried a new scent work venue last weekend, hosted by the Columbia Basin Dog Training Club at Benton City. Otter stayed home on Saturday but picked up a 2<sup>nd</sup> place Q in Master's Exterior on Sunday. Iskie Q'd all five of her runs, with three 1<sup>st</sup> places and two 3<sup>rd</sup> places. This trial proved to be a great choice for Iskie, as it was held in a quiet rural setting with a small number of participants. Iskie practiced "minding our own business" as we waited our turn, and also got to practice "polite greeting" with several of the friendly dog-savvy volunteers. She earned her Interior Excellent and Exterior Excellent titles, and then tried her first Master's run, in Interior, on Sunday. On the second room, she circuited the room then stopped and looked at me with a pretty clear look of "I'm really confused - I can't find it?" I realized that I hadn't practiced blank rooms with her! There's a whole bunch of new things we will need to train this winter: high hides, inaccessible hides, food distractions, larger areas, and blank rooms.

Iskie started her scent work classes as a puppy in 2019, taking Scent Work 1 and 2 at Appleatchee and Scent Work 3 and 4 in the first sessions at the brand new WKC training center. We then took more than 3 years off from scent work classes (due to a combination of no evening classes and also working through her anxiety issues), but restarted classes this spring. So she and I have gotten to take classes from almost all the WKC Scent Work instructors. She's had 37 runs since we started trialing this spring, and she's Q'd in 34 of them – and I think her growing confidence and skill is due to our dedicated WKC teachers. Many thanks to Marcia and Rich Greenwood and Mike and Jan Barclay for a solid foundation in scent work, and thanks to Tracy Lloyd, Cassie Paxton, and Paula Arno Martinez for teaching new evening classes this year, and thanks to Jan Flatten, Jan and Rich Evans, and Diane Gallatin, who have been helping us work on more advanced skills. And thanks to everyone for helping Iskie and I work through reactivity and environment issues!
