Required Landscaping

Landscaping has been a hugely successful Club effort. Thanks to the Merrimans for sharing their expertise in all phases from planning to planting.

"Merrimans did a good job meshing the location with the building code requirements. It looks pretty neat...", said Chuck St. John.

This fall the number of volunteers working on the property on any day varied from one or two, to a faithful five to 10. Saturday of the Planting Party nearly 30 WKCers turned out with their gardening equipment. The planting of plants and trees, and irrigation progress extended for several days. The Planting Parties will continue next spring.

Referring to the 1st Street side of the property, Betsy Metcalf said, "That is one long parking strip! And LOTS of plants." Betsy is right. That planting strip along the parking strip is about 320 feet long and 5 feet wide. There are also 6 planters that have been planted. In the spring the plan is to plant ground cover that will grow over the weed block fabric.

Next spring the remaining perimeter will be landscaped, the irrigation lines will be run, and the outdoor practice areas established. Already a neighbor has complemented us on the way the property is looking.

Carrie Coleman submitted application for a Community Foundation Regional Impact Grant before the August 1 deadline. Our request is for funds for outdoor practice areas and required landscaping. October 3 the WKC grant committee met on site with 4 members of the Community Foundation grant committee. We seemed to have made a good impression with the Training Center and volunteers working on the property. Keep your fingers crossed. We should know around the first of November.
