WKC and COVID-19

The WKC Board has drafted a COVID policy statement. Representatives of the instructors and the building committee have reviewed and commented on it. The goal is to make the WKC Training Center Classes COVID-19 Guidelines conform to the Wenatchee Valley Chamber of Commerce Business Safety Plan Worksheet and identify the actions we need to have in place to manage classes at the Center during Phase 1.5.

An inquiry has been made to the WA State COVID-19 website requesting help to identify into which Business Category they would deem WKC to fall. We might fit Phase 1 Higher Education and Critical Infrastructure Workforce Training COVID-19 Requirements.

We did hear back from the Chelan/Douglas Health District for approval of our plan.

We are currently working to determine class size and other requirements. We are hopeful that some classes will be offered starting in July. It is probable that all students and instructors will be required to wear a mask a majority of the time unless there is a health reason, or communication issue with being masked. The WKC Training Center must comply with the rules of the Health Departments during this time of crisis.




WKC Members' News and Brags
