

AGRICULTURAL DETECTION DOG PILOT PROJECT

On August 5th the WKC Agricultural Detection Dogs showed off their skills for evaluation by Dr. Nathan Hall, Director of the Canine Olfaction Laboratory at Texas Tech University. In a double- blind study, each dog ran through a sequence of five practice runs followed by ten test runs to identity the positive sample of cherry wood with Little Cherry Disease. The dogs gave strong performances in correctly identifying the diseased cherry wood samples. And on a control run one dog clearly indicated to its handler, "Mom, there isn't any disease here!"

Following Dr. Hall's evaluation of Hallie McMullen's counterpart program in Idaho this weekend, we look forward to receiving an official report on the performance of the two groups. The report will provide credibility to the WKC Ag Dog pilot project, allowing us to seek funding grants to further the project.

The next giant step will be to transition these agricultural detection skills from classroom to nursery tree and cherry orchard settings.

DIET-RELATED CANINE HEART DISEASE

In 2018, the Food and Drug Administration started to investigate reports of canine dilated cardiomyopathy (DCM) in dogs eating grain-free and specialty diets. A new study (www.nature.com/articles/s41598-021-94464-2) published this month reports that peas were the ingredient most associated with DCM. An AKC article on the topic (heart-disease) suggests that if you are feeding a "grain-free" food that has peas as a primary ingredient (top 10), you should consult with your veterinarian to determine if you need to make a change to your dog's diet.
