Good News! Grants and Loans!

Last month, August 2021, WKC Grant Writer Carrie Colman received a call from the North Central Washington Community Foundation. She was asked if WKC would still like the \$14,300 grant requested and denied in 2020. WKC received and deposited the \$14,300 Non-Profit Reemergence Grant check in early September 2021.

Supplemental income has also come from other Grants and Loans. In July of 2021 WKC applied for and received a \$10,000 Small Business Administration (SBA) Targeted Economic Injury Disaster Loan Program (EIDL) Advance. This advance does NOT need to be repaid.

In July of 2020 WKC applied for and received a \$5,000 Grant from the Douglas County Small Business Support Initiative. In June of 2020 WKC also received a loan from the SBA of \$61,500 under the Economic Injury Disaster Loan Program (EIDL). This is a 30-year loan at an interest rate of 2.75%, and the payments were deferred for 12 months.

The WKC Board has approved a WKC Grant request for the Goodfellow Bros. \$50.000 "Centennial Celebration Grant to a charitable organization located in, or directly serving, a community in which we live and work". Cross your fingers, toes and paws! (One of the seven WKC Founding Trustees, 1961, was Mrs. Robert C. **Goodfellow**.)

Even though WKC was closed to classes for 4 months last year due to Covid, generous member donations, grants and loans allowed us to contract Octavio Rodriguez to lay sod on the west outdoor training area last fall, the east training ring this summer and install additional irrigation sprinklers. Club members successfully managed the grounds through the heat wave. WKC is "Looking Good!"

WKC Agricultural Detection Dog Project

CONGRATULATIONS, AG DOGS!

This inspirational WKC Agricultural Detection Dog pilot project successfully completed its first phase in August. During the 14-week proof-of-concept study, dog/handler teams learned to identify in cherry wood samples the aromatic volatiles associated with specific disease pathogens of Little Cherry Disease. Amazingly, dogs are able to detect both viral and bacterial pathogens in LCD variants. The goal is that trained detection dogs might serve as an early warning tool for helping eradicate a disease that is decimating the Washington cherry industry.

In August, Dr. Nathan Hall, director, Canine Olfaction Lab at Texas Tech University, evaluated the performance of Ag Dog teams at both Wenatchee, WA and Boise, ID. Each of the six dogs in Wenatchee and five dogs at Boise underwent an extensive double-blind test of five practice runs followed by ten test runs.

Dr. Hall described the results: "Six of eleven dogs showed successful discrimination of the diseased tree cutting from non-diseased tree cuttings exceeding that expected by chance. Two of the dogs showed proficiency at or exceeding 90% accuracy." His assessment of the WKC project and companion project in Idaho: "Together, these results provide a positive proof of concept that citizen science trained dogs can successfully discriminate little cherry disease positive tree clipping from disease negative tree clippings, but that not all dogs meet proficiency to demonstrate above chance performance."

Congratulations to all the participants in this novel citizen led research project involving development of canine agricultural detection skills for the ultimate benefit of the WA cherry industry. Special appreciation to instructors Mike and Jan Barclay, horticulturists Teah Smith and Hannah Walters, consulting detection dog trainer Hallie McMullen, along with videographers John and Helen Njus, and project coordinator Lynda Pheasant for so admirably accomplishing this first phase of the pilot project.

Super "Qs" to all Ag Dog teams, especially Angel (black German Shepherd Dog) and Linda McFarland; Aspen (Australian Shepherd) and Jan Flatten; Cubby (Entlebucher Mountain Dog) and Sue Edick; Darby (Border Collie) and Linda Harbury; Otter (yellow Labrador Retriever) and Tara Barrett; and Zenyatta (Rhodesian Ridgeback) and Betsy Metcalf. You are awesome!

While two first-phase members are choosing to focus on other interests, Ag Dogs are welcoming new members **Gigi** (Standard Poodle) and Linda Hessel and **Milly** (German Shorthaired Pointer) and Ellie Russell to the next phase. The WA Tree Fruit Research Commission has invited WKC to submit a research pre-proposal for 2022 funding, and several WSU researchers have eagerly expressed a commitment to cooperate with the WKC Agricultural Detection Dog project.
