

Zenyatta is a Star!

One of our WKC dogs was recently featured in the national magazine 'The Ridgeback,' in an article written by Zen's owner, Betsy Metcalf. You may remember that Zenyatta was the first WKC dog to earn her AKC Detective title at our fall Scent Work trial. But what we didn't know then was that Zenyatta was also the first Rhodesian Ridgeback to earn the coveted AKC Detective title! Here's a few excerpts from the article:



AKC started their Scent Work in 2017. Catcher (Zenyatta's granddam) got a few Qs as an old dog, and Zanadew (Zenyatta's dam) took off going to Excellent quickly before I lost her in 2019. Zenyatta knew the basics but was doing agility and lure coursing so was not seriously trialing yet. However, she was practicing difficult hides at home and learning odor behavior.

Our first Detective run was 2022 in a wind storm and we missed one hide. But it was fun and the fun continued the next day when Zenyatta got her TDX in almost as much wind. We finally got our first Detective Qualifying score (Q) that fall in Spokane and actually got another the next day! Now I am addicted! Qualifying scores in Detective are very precious: a weekend of 30 runs with 1 to 3 Qs is normal.

Our Detective journey took just over a year and we got our final Q at our home trial the day after my birthday. We were at the fairgrounds and between the beef and horse barns. Breeze into my face, Zen pulled me across the area. A critter? No, the first hide! Then back into the horse barn and into a room on the left: a hide on the shelves to the right. Zen leads me across the room to a hide on the left side. Out of that room, she checks under the tails of the two full-sized plastic horses in the aisle (really, Zen?). Back outside, she checks the stuff on the way to the beef barn: a hide on the door going into the beef barn. Inside, Zen circles around the trailers and equipment in the barn and finds two more hides. My heart rate is really high now as we are having a great run with time left. Zen says she is done, but I take her outside to check the left side of the barn for a start line threshold hide just to be sure. Finish? "Yes," says the judge, and the celebration starts! Detective Dog Zenyatta!

Zenyatta is also known as FC Int'l CH Arr Zenyatta Dew RA TDX SC AX AXJ NAP NJP NFP BCAT SWD SHDE RATO CGC TKA VCX.

And her pedigree is: GChP Bakari's Lor Vitra Caymus $SC \times Ch$ Arr Zanadew Dreams TD, AX, AXJ, RA, SWA, RATN, TKA, SHDA, SCE, SIE, SEE, CGC.




